# Annual Report

To be presented to the District Board:

The overall performance of our school is documented in the ODE 13-14 report card. Therefore, our summary will reflect the information contained therein. In summary: in grades 3-5, 75% met the state reading benchmark, 65% met the benchmark in Math; in grades 6-8 84% met their reading benchmark, and 70% met the benchmark in math; finally, 85% of 11th graders met the reading benchmark and 74% met their math benchmark. What can we take away from this? Generally speaking, all students are on track to grow to meet their benchmarks, and most students have already met these achievements.

The next item in our report concerns school attendance. During this past school year the school had a 93% attendance rate, and 5 out of school suspensions were reported.

Finally, in keeping with our charter mission we have met and/or progressed towards many of our stated goals. TLCS goals pertaining to field trips and natural resource goals were met in the following ways: the kindergarten class has succeeded in growing a garden. This included learning about pumpkin patches and apple orchards during their fall field trip. The high school students enjoyed a natural resource enrichment field trip to Crater Lake. Triangle Lake upperclassmen attended the largest and most successful Ashland field trip yet in Triangle Lake history; this was a large undertaking.

As we transition from how the school met natural resource and field trip goals to how we met our technological goals, it seems perfect to start with an example of both! Triangle Lake students had the rare opportunity of attending an overnight trip to the Oregon Museum of Science and Industry. The robotics program was also introduced -- to immediate student enthusiasm. And finally, Chromebooks were allocated on a one-to-one basis in the high school -- the importance of this last piece cannot be overstated. Having one-to-one technology support in our high school classrooms has eliminated wasteful netbook check-out time and empowered students in ways that weren't even possible beforehand.

Some other continued programs of note are K-12 PE, Culinary arts, Free breakfast, and the Fresh fruit and vegetables program -- all of which continue to flourish at our ever-growing and improving charter school.
