


CDL Tips for Students & Families

Learning Environment

- **Quiet space** for learning is helpful. Headphones with a microphone can be helpful for blocking out background noise.
- **Comfortable space** for learning is great, but no special furniture is necessary. It may be helpful to set up a designated learning spot. Others may find it best to identify a few different places that may work throughout the day to help break the day up and keep you engaged.
- **Organized Materials** - keeping your learning materials organized will help you be successful. You may want to set up a tray, box, or drawer to keep all learning tools in.

Clothing and Conduct

- **Dress appropriately** for school. You may chose more comfortable clothes for learning at home, but please make sure your clothing would still be appropriate for a school day (be aware of words/images on shirts and in backgrounds, etc.)
- **Treat others with respect** and let your teacher know if someone is not treating you with respect so they may help you.
- **Keep microphone muted** when you are not speaking during Laker LIVE times. This helps everyone in the class hear everything.
- **Cameras should be on** when teachers request them to be on. If you feel uncomfortable, or your parents do not want your camera on, communicate with your teacher and they can create a plan with your family.



Equipment

- **You are responsible for damage to District equipment.** Please help us take care of the equipment. The District will need to charge families to repair/replace damaged items.
- **Chromebooks should be carried only when closed.** Be sure to hold it by the base (and never by the screen).
- **Workbooks and textbooks (& other supplies sent home)** are school property and it is important to take care of them. Keep them dry, store them in a safe place, and make sure you have clean hands when using them.
- **Return items** - all items checked out to students will need to be returned at the end of the year, or when done using them.

Due Dates and Attendance

- **If you are ill,** let your teacher(s) know and they will work with you to plan for catching up when you are better.
- **Attendance is taken each day, in each class.** Students need to engage in learning with every class, every school day. This can be: attending a Laker LIVE session, submitting work, participating in class discussion, emailing or calling a teacher, or getting help during office hours.
